- ~ Mandatory overnight training week August 11th - 13th and 16th through 27th.
- ~ Will supervise 3 Crew Members and 1 Assistant Crew Leader.
- ~ Pay rate: \$16.50/hour
- ~ Positions open in Espanola and Jemez Pueblo

DESIRED QUALIFICATIONS

- ~ Experience in a leadership position working with youth.
- ~ Ability to perform strenuous work outdoors for long hours in rough country and inclement weather.
- ~ Excellent oral and written communication skills.
- ~ Ability to work independently.
- ~ Pass a background check.
- ~ Possess a valid drivers license and safe driving record.
- ~ Experience performing natural resource management projects.
- ~ Must have previous outdoor leadership experience.
- ~ Preferred candidate will be a qualified Wildland FFT2. Greater preference will be given to candidates qualified as FFT1 and/or that have previous wildland firefighting experience.
- ~ Must be able to pass an arduous pack test.
