The Wildfire Resilience Coalition (WRC) seeks to help federal, tribal, state, local, and private partners realize transformational change in how wildfire risk is managed in the United States. Our members include key stakeholders, partners, and implementers who are critical to successful implementation across all lands and is intended to offer a focal point for engagement among diverse interests within the administration, Congress, and policy and opinion leaders.

The WRC leverages investments and authorities for wildfire resilience in the Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act (IIJA) and Inflation Reduction Act (IRA) to improve coordination, transparency, and implementation of science-based mitigation measures.

WRC participants are committed to supporting federal land and fire management agencies in leveraging this surge in funding to break from the status quo. Additionally, the WRC provides a platform for shared accountability, ensuring that these efforts lead to meaningful and sustained change.

Formation

Launched in Fall 2022, the WRC builds on the success of the diverse coalition that led to the 2018 Fire Fix. WRC is a broad coalition bringing practitioner insights to policy makers.

Key Initiatives & Successes

The WRC has engaged with legislative and agency leaders on wildland firefighter pay, the recommendations of the Wildland Fire Mitigation and Management Commission, and the need for sustained investment in resilience.

Future Goals

The WRC aims to continue expanding its collaborative efforts, enhancing resilience through innovative strategies, and securing ongoing funding to support comprehensive wildfire mitigation.


How To Get Involved

Wildfire resilience refers to a suite of actions taken to prepare for, recover from, and reduce the risks and impacts of increasingly severe wildfire events. The 2014 National Cohesive Wildland Fire Management Strategy established three overarching goals aimed at fostering resilient landscapes, fire adapted communities and a safe and effective wildfire response. Wildfire resilience focuses on actions taken before and after fires for these first two goals.
