Fall Fire and Fuels Program - Job Announcement

The Forest Stewards Guild is hiring crew leads and crew members in **Mountainair, Pueblo of Jemez, and Santa Fe, New Mexico** to work alongside Forest Service and Natural Resource Department employees!



**Become a certified
Wildland Firefighter
while receiving training
and getting paid!**



Benefits:

- Crews receive wildland firefighting and chainsaw certifications
- Crews receive CPR and First Aid certifications.
- Professional development such as resumé building, interviewing practice, and personal finance.
- Crew Leads receive \$20.00/hr with the potential of OT.
- Crew Members receive \$18.00/hr with the potential of OT.
- Holiday pay, sick leave, and cultural pay available for all crews.

What to expect:

The program runs for 13 weeks from Aug. 20th-Nov. 14th, 40 hours/week. Crews will complete natural resource management projects (forest thinning, trail maintenance, invasive species removal) and participate in prescribed fire operations when conditions and weather permit. The fall program will start with an overnight training at Cottonwood Gulch in Thoreau, NM. For the remainder of the program, each crew will report to their respective duty station. FSYC participants must supply their own wildland fire fighting boots, reimbursement is available. All other personal protective equipment will be provided.
